

Our nesting box and camera set up were given to us by our children as a Christmas present a few years ago, and it is fair to say that they are amongst the best Christmas presents we have ever received.

EDITORIAL

It is very good indeed to see from the reports in this issue that activities of numerous kinds are now starting to get back to normal in our villages. Open gardens, tea-and-meets, WIs, the Film Club, the Horticultural Society and many others are either operating again or making plans to do so. Theatres etc. too are re-opening, and June and I had dinner at the Fox and Hounds last night (our first meal there for 6 months, and their first day of full re-opening).

So it looks very likely indeed that life is now returning to normal - provided that plans are not derailed by the doom mongers!

Deaths from all causes are now the lowest since records began, and those from Covid (daily average in single figures) are well below those from heart disease, accidents, cancer, smoking related illness etc.

All of this is very largely the result of vaccinations, so do not be a vaccine denier - get yours as soon as you can.

he hedgehogs have now emerged from their winter hibernation and are resuming their nocturnal patrols of the village gardens. Last summer there were 5 or 6 who came every evening to eat outside our kitchen window and it was a delight to watch them. Then one day in November we found one very small one wandering in the garden instead of hibernating. He would have stood no chance of surviving the winter on his own at his weight so we took him to a wildlife rescue centre in Staverton. Sadly he did not survive there either, but this week we collected from the rescue centre one of their other unclaimed strays (if that's the right word), along with a little girl friend to keep him company! We are now looking forward to their starting a family and delighting us again. We are hoping that when two of our grandchildren come to stay next weekend (the first time we shall have

seen them in the flesh since last August) we shall all be able to watch them again.

And finally, thank you very much indeed to the many of you who have sent kind messages about last month's issue and its Benefice and Link history. I am very grateful to you for your comments and for taking the trouble to contact me.

Perhaps a whole service isn't for you, but If you just want to explore, discover and grow then you can access the weekly teaching from the Bible because our sermons are available to listen to on the website, or download as a printed document. Again, we have no way of tracking who might do that.

Now, of course, we would love you to join us in person in our buildings and become part of our church family, but we appreciate that it might take time and not a little courage to do that. In the meantime, why not explore the website and become a virtual member, and if that's what you want to remain as, that's fine too. We will never know you've been unless you tell us, but it doesn't mean we are not praying for you already.

Extension of 30 mph limit – The parish council are investigating with the Highway Authority the prospect of extending the 30 mph limit on Daventry Road to above the Burial Ground, as well as both sides of the crossroads at Daventry Road / Stavertor Road.

Grass Cutting - To give the village a more 'cared for' appearance, the contractors who cut the grass around the village have been asked to collect the cuttings from the central areas and wherever else it is possible.
