EDITORIAL

Co what have you given up for Lent?

"The purpose of Lent is the preparation of the believer for Easter through prayer, fasting, and alms-giving (the 3 pillars of Lent), as well as mortifying the flesh, repentance of sins, simple living, and self denial."

You should be able to think of something in that lot! How about giving up dieting or stop cutting back on alcohol? Or you could give up pancakes, or hot cross buns, or Easter eggs; or red wine (just drink white). You could give up The News, Donald Trump, or buying products exported from the USA, or even go the full Benedictine of poverty, chastity and obedience; (a bit like marriage really!).

It puts me in mind of when we lived in Bahrain nearly 60 years ago where the Muslim population took Ramadan (a similar period of fasting etc.) much more seriously than we do Lent. We had a lovely cheerful houseboy called Suleiman whose family lived in Oman but he had left them there to come to Bahrain to earn money to send back home. He took Ramadan very seriously and observed a strict starvation during the day including not drinking even water despite temperatures of 35° to 40°+. I felt very sorry for him as he went about his work sweating profusely in our not-very-well-air-conditioned flat but unable to slake his thirst. Yet despite all that he would sometimes bring little delicacies which he had cooked for us. Then as soon as the sun set we could see from our balcony the inhabitants of the neighbouring houses all coming out into the streets or onto their rooves where they would cheerfully and noisily "break fast".

ast week I encountered in Tesco a woman I had not seen for many, many years though I had looked after her and her family when she was a small child. She greeted me with expressions of delight and we had a long chat, but when I asked "and how are your family?" she replied "They are all very well thank you. My eldest will be 30 this year"....

Another reminder of the passing years occurred when I saw "Cold Comfort Farm" at Badby Film

Society recently. The last shot was of a couple taking to the air in what I am sure was a Tiger Moth, which took me straight back to my youth when I got my Private Pilot's Licence in a Tiger Moth in 1958.

Those were the days!!

Coming back up to date, our hedgehogs have not yet put in an appearance in daylight (though we have seen what appears to be some hedgehog pooh on the lawn) but the other night we saw on the nesting box camera that a blue tit was fast asleep in the box. The box was quite bare, not a sign of a nest or nesting materials, and that has been repeated for the last several nights. Perhaps like a seasoned house-hunter he/she is trying it out before making a firm offer.

PASTORAL LETTER

Start where you are

Nothing seems to have caused more upset over recent months than the meeting in the Oval Office between the President of the United States (and his entourage) and the President of Ukraine. Personally, I found it very painful to watch, but what can I do? Perhaps we are too often left in total frustration or helpless anger as world-shaping news seeps into the security of our living rooms. Here's the good news: Just because you can't change everything doesn't mean you can't change anything.

When I was a curate in Bristol Diocese. the former Archbishop of York, Stuart Blanch, visited the curates and asked how many of us were working in large parishes. Many of us dutifully raised our hands. He said, "Just because you can't visit everybody doesn't mean that you can't visit anybody." That principle is true in a number of areas of life. Just because you cannot bring peace to the Middle East or to Ukraine, does not mean that you cannot work for peace in your family, or amongst your work colleagues, or in your community, or even in your church. Start where you are.

When Jesus left his disciples, he told them to begin changing the world where they were (in Jerusalem) and then move on from there, to the ends of the earth. That's great advice. Start where you are.

In the 6th Century BC, the Chinese philosopher, Lao Tzu, said, "A journey of a thousand miles begins with a single step." Take that single step. However helpless we feel when watching the news and however appalled we are at the conduct of leaders, we can start to make a difference where we are.

Jesus said, "If you give even a cup of cold water to one of the least of my followers, you will surely be rewarded." Most of us can manage a cup of cold water. Start where you are and, in this year of prayer, surround your action in prayer. Like the young boy at the 'Feeding of the Five Thousand', put your offering into Jesus's hands and watch him do extraordinary things.

According to the critics: "The brilliant minds behind 'Shaun of the Dead' successfully take a shot at the buddy cop genre; the result is a bitingly satiric and



Pots & Plans: what to do in your garden this April

Sowing vegetables

I love sowing veg seeds. So it's hard to resist filling up every space and pot during April.

Instead I restrain myself, and sow seeds little and often. This 'succession' sowing gives lots of smaller harvests over time. This staggered cropping also gives 'horticultural insurance' if one batch of plants falls foul of a pest or the weather.

Leave 3-4 weeks between sowing: carrots, beetroot, lettuce, pea, coriander, rocket, spinach, French beans, radish, mini cabbage. Plus spring onions, basil, cilantro, dill, kohl rabi, mizuna, Swiss chard... and other crops that are harvestable within a few weeks of sowing.

Prune early spring flowering shrubs

Forsythia and Ribes have done their thing with a blaze of colour. Now's the time to prune. Cut back flowered stems to a strong bud and remove any dead and congested wood. This encourages new growth and ensures a bountiful display next year. Snip, shape, and secure that future floral show.

Start mowing lawns regularly

Lawns are growing fast. Raise the mower blades for the first few cuts, then gradually lower them. Regular mowing keeps the grass healthy and weakens weeds. Sharp mower blades help a lot as they give healthier cuts and speed up mowing.

Check garden structures

April is a good time to assess your garden structures. Check fences, trellises, archways, and sheds for damage. This is a useful before the spring growth of heavy climbers and before border plants reduce access. Repair or replace any broken structures. I also like to clean patios and decking with a brush or powerwasher for safer access during spring cocktails.

In with the spuds

It's time to plant out seed potatoes about six inches deep. Plant 1ft apart in rows 1.5ft apart (more if growing larger 'maincrop' varieties). You needn't dig the soil beforehand, unless removing perennial weeds or the soil is very compact. Growing and harvesting potatoes will in fact loosen up the soil nicely for another veg crop later in the year or next.

The weather is still chilly, so protect emerging potato shoots from frost with horticultural fleece. Then once your plants are about 1ft tall, 'earth-up' by pulling up soil from between rows to partially cover the leaves (leaving 6in. of growth above ground each time). Repeat once or twice as plants grow. This increases yield.

Check young trees

Many young trees die when their stakes and ties become too tight or rub off bark. Check your trees this spring and each season to ensure ties are supportive, but not restrictive. Or remove the stake if the tree is robust without support.

Right, I'm off to do some weeding.

Council Update

As well as standard agenda material, the March meeting discussed updates on flood prevention, the forthcoming local elections and the Church path railings project.

We continue to work closely with West Northants Council and the Badby Flood Warden in response to the **flooding** in Newnham in November 2024, and with a view to finding a long-term solution to minimise flood risks in the area.

Amongst other interventions, this will include clearing of ditches on the Preston Capes Road and regular gully clearing.

The Parish Council are looking into supplying sandbags to residents in and around Badby Road and Bradbury Road to provide aid should they be required whilst the long-term solutions are being imple mented. In the autumn there will be a public event for residents to fill and take away sandbags in case of emergency.

Unfortunately, there is no quick-fix solution, but we will endeavour to accomplish, and lobby for, the work that is required to prevent future flooding.

In addition to the work in response to November's flooding, we are continuing to push West Northants Council to complete the remaining phases of the drainage work which focussed on The Green last summer. The work remaining is the examination and clearance of the drainage system on Daventry Road and Newnham Hill, to reduce the volume of water flowing down the road into the village.

The **grass mowing** season has started! The Parish Council is responsible for the mowing of the Greens and open spaces, the verges within the village, the Churchyard and the Burial Ground. Grass will be mown weekly until July, then fortnightly thereafter. If you feel that areas are being missed, please contact the Council so that we can bring this to the attention of the contractor.

Preparations for the **celebration of the 80th Anniversary of VE Day** continue to take shape. There will be a Beacon bonfire on Thursday 8th May with a party on The Green on Saturday 10th May. The marquee has been booked and the Newnham band has re-formed, 1940s dress will be encouraged, there will be '40s themed food and there are rumours that the Newnham choir will be resurrected to perform songs from this era.

West Northamptonshire Council Unitary and Parish Council elections will be held on Thursday 1st May 2025. Voters will be able to vote for candidates to fill parish council seats (if the election is contested), and all of West Northamptonshire Council's seats (1st May elections will elect 76 councillors to represent 35 wards)

I would like to thank Jim Simpson and Jude Dorkins for planting the daffodils in front of the new village entrance signs, and to thank Deidre Mobbs for all she does for the snowdrop spectacle in the village.
